**QUESTIONS AND RESPONSES
TO THE ToR**

Dear Sirs,

The Contracting Authority presents below question and response to the ToR, in the procedure conducted for the abovementioned scope:

Question 3:

Could you please clarify the terms and conditions of payment for the second payment? This payment is effective only if partial deliveries are made by the 17th November 2025, which is unlikely to happen because the contract may not be signed by that date or at best the project will be in its early design phase. Could you please also confirm if alternative payment conditions can be proposed with the bid?

Response 3:

The Contracting Authority clarifies that, in the case of partial deliveries, it is not required to physically deliver individual components/elements to the Contracting Authority (NSRC Solaris, Czerwone Maki 98, Krakow, Poland). However, a formal acceptance protocol of the elements is necessary (documented, including serial numbers and marked as the property of Solaris) in the form specified in the draft of the contract. These elements may remain with the Contractor until the FAT tests and final delivery to NSRC Solaris.

Due to the financing rules of the subject contract, the Contracting Authority requires that part of the contract be executed in the current year. The Contracting Authority only indicates the maximum value of the second payment. Considering the above, the Contracting Authority does not foresee any changes to the payment terms furthermore, the Contractor may not offer alternative payment methods in its bid.

At the same time, the contracting authority informs that the above question and response form an integral part of the Terms of Reference and their provision does not affect the need to amend the contract notice or the deadline for submitting and opening tenders.
